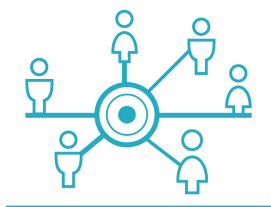

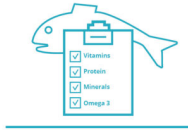
'Reducing inequalities for food security and nutrition' by HLPE-FSN

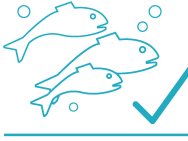

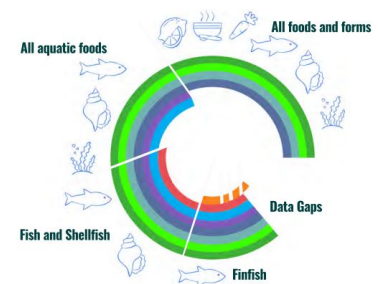
